
## **UBCV Non-Academic Misconduct Process Overview**

What happens when non-academic misconduct is suspected or a complaint is made? Review the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> in the UBC Academic Calendar for important details.



## Who is the Student Conduct Manager (SCM)?

The Student Conduct Manager (SCM) meets with the student and either facilitates an early, informal resolution or refers the case directly to the Non-Academic Misconduct Committee (NAMC) for a hearing.

## What is the Non-Academic Misconduct Committee (NAMC)?

If the SCM refers a matter to the NAMC, the NAMC assists the President by investigating the allegations of non-academic misconduct made against UBC Vancouver and UBC Okanagan students under their respective Student Codes of Conduct and reports their findings to the President. Students have an opportunity to meet with the NAMC to present their information and respond to the allegations. However, only the President has the power to discipline students, and this may only occur after a NAMC hearing.

After the hearing, the NAMC will review all relevant materials and submit a report of its findings to the President. Based on the NAMC's findings, the President decides what disciplinary measure, if any, should be imposed on the student.

## APPEAL

The student has the right to appeal any disciplinary decision of the President to the Senate within 45 calendar days of receipt of the President's decision letter. Resources and policies on the appeal process can be found online.
